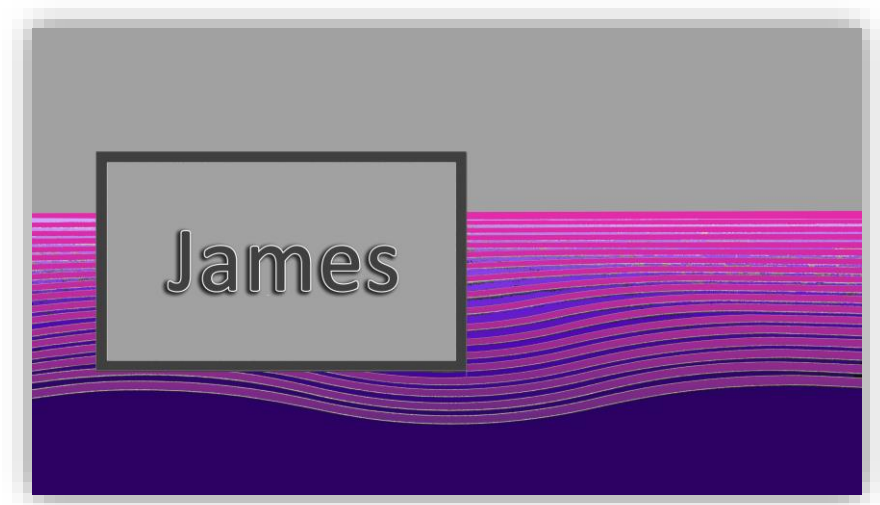


Personal Application and Conversations
