
Personal Application and Conversations

- 1. What do you do to make people feel welcome in your home or at church?

Correctly Handling the Word of Truth (Cont.)

2 Timothy 2:20-26

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White the realization of the sentence of death hanging over him, Paul's attention is focused on the challenges Timothy is facing. This pastoral epistle has been a wonderful resource for churches, their pastors, and elders. It's a primer for equipping spiritual leaders. We all need to ask ourselves; how do we handle the Word of God when others are spinning their philosophies in directions that are contrary to the will of God? This side of heaven, disrupters can confuse the body of Christ, and every leader must make sure he's "an instrument for noble purposes, made holy, useful to the Master and prepared to do any good work" (2 Tim. 2:21). So, let's reboot our study in 2 Timothy 2, and make sure we are correctly handling the Word of truth.

Cleanse yourself for noble purposes (v. 21)

Flee the evil desires of youth (v. 22a)

Pursue righteousness, faith, love, and peace (v. 22b)

• With those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart (v. 22c)

• Avoid quarreling (vs. 14, 23)

• Be kind and able to teach (v. 24)

• Gently instruct those who oppose you (vs. 25-26)
